Vision, Mission and Values Statement

Vision

The NPAT vision is to achieve **educational excellence, create opportunities and enrich lives**.

Mission

We will do this by developing a **multi-academy trust of highly effective and** sustainable schools.

Values Statement

We know that there is greater potential for realising our vision through working together as a family of schools providing support, collaboration and challenge. We are 'one school with many doors'. Our collective strength is epitomised through a shared focus on ensuring great teaching and curriculum, focussing on the most efficient use of resources in order to provide maximum value for money. Although our schools retain their own individual, unique character our strength is built on synergy - the belief that we can achieve more collectively than alone.

We have clear values and beliefs that guide us in how we act and in decisions that we make. We are driven by the determination to ensure that our schools sit at the heart of their local communities and are drivers for educational excellence for all. Our moral purpose is rooted in high aspiration and ambition for all children, including those who face the greatest disadvantage in our most deprived communities and children with Special Educational Needs and Disability. We are responsible for developing future citizens who have a voice that is heard, and who understand their place and responsibility in society.

We ensure that we use evidence-based research to inform our educational priorities.

We recognise the importance of both high academic achievement and the
development of the whole child through a wide range of opportunities with external
partners, including the Royal Shakespeare Company and National Gallery.

We will abide by the Principles of Public Life:

Selflessness

We will act solely in terms of the public interest.

Integrity

We will avoid placing ourselves under any obligation to people or organisations that might try inappropriately to influence us in our work. We will not act or take decisions in order to gain financial or other material benefits for ourselves, our family, or our friends. We will declare and resolve any interests and relationships.



Objectivity

We will act and take decisions impartially, fairly and on merit, using the best evidence and without discrimination or bias.

Accountability

We are accountable to the public for our decisions and actions and will submit ourselves to the scrutiny necessary to ensure this.

Openness

We will act and take decisions in an open and transparent manner. Information will not be withheld from the public unless there are clear and lawful reasons for so doing.

Honesty

We will be truthful.

Leadership

We will exhibit these principles in our own behaviour. We will actively promote and robustly support the principles and be willing to challenge poor behaviour wherever it occurs.

We will apply the highest standards and will:

- 1. act within our powers
- 2. promote the success of the Trust
- 3. exercise independent judgement
- 4. exercise reasonable care, skill and diligence
- 5. avoid conflicts of interest
- 6. not accept benefits from third parties
- 7. declare interest in proposed transactions or arrangements.

We will focus on our core governance functions:

- 1. ensuring there is clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction
- 2. holding executive leaders to account for the educational performance of the organisation and its pupils and the performance management of staff
- overseeing the financial performance of the organisation and making sure its money is well spent

NGA recognises the following as the fourth core function of governance:

4. ensuring the voices of stakeholders are heard.

As individuals, we agree to:

Fulfil our role & responsibilities

- 1. We accept that our role is strategic and so will focus on our core functions rather than involve ourselves in day-to-day management.
- 2. We will fulfil our role and responsibilities as set out in our <u>scheme of delegation</u>.
- 3. We will develop, share and live the ethos and values of our Trust.
- 4. We agree to adhere to Trust policies and procedures.



- 5. We will work collectively for the benefit of the Trust.
- 6. We will be candid but constructive and respectful when holding senior leaders to account.
- 7. We will consider how our decisions may affect the Trust and local community.
- 8. We will stand by the decisions that we make as a collective.
- Where decisions and actions conflict with the Seven Principles of Public Life or may place pupils at risk, we will speak up and bring this to the attention of the relevant authorities.
- 10. We will only speak or act on behalf of the Trust Board if we have the authority to do so.
- 11. **Trustees**: We will fulfil our responsibilities as a good employer, acting fairly and without prejudice.
- 12. When making or responding to complaints, we will follow the established procedures.
- 13. We will strive to uphold the Trust's reputation in our private communications (including on social media).
- 14. We will have regard to our responsibilities under <u>The Equality Act</u> and will work to advance equality of opportunity for all.
- 15. Local governors: We will act as the local ambassadors for our Trust.

Demonstrate our commitment to the role

- 1. We will involve ourselves actively in the work of the board and accept our fair share of responsibilities, serving on committees or working groups where required.
- 2. We will make every effort to attend all meetings and where we cannot attend explain in advance why we are unable to.
- 3. We will arrive at meetings prepared, having read all papers in advance, ready to make a positive contribution and observe protocol.
- 4. We will get to know the school/s well and welcome opportunities to be involved in school activities.
- 5. We will visit the school/s and when doing so will make arrangements with relevant staff in advance and observe school and board protocol.
- 6. When visiting a school in a personal capacity (for example, as a parent or carer), we will continue to honour the commitments made in this code.
- 7. We will participate in induction training, attend the NPAT annual conference, read DfE and NGA documentation about the role of governors/trustees and take responsibility for developing our individual and collective skills and knowledge on an ongoing basis.

Build and maintain relationships

1. We will develop effective working relationships with leaders, staff, parents and other relevant stakeholders from our local communities.



- 2. **Local governors:** We will champion the voices of our school community and stakeholders.
- 3. Local governors: We will establish effective working relationships with trustees.
- 4. Trustees: We will engage with and be accountable to local governors.
- 5. We will express views openly, courteously and respectfully in all our communications with board members and staff both inside and outside of meetings.
- 6. We will work to create an inclusive environment where each board member's contributions are valued equally.
- 7. We will support the chair in their role of leading the board and ensuring appropriate conduct.

Respect confidentiality

- 1. We will observe complete confidentiality both inside and outside of the Trust when matters are deemed confidential or where they concern individual staff, pupils or families.
- 2. We will not reveal the details of any governing board vote.
- 3. We will ensure all confidential papers are held and disposed of appropriately.
- 4. We will maintain confidentiality even after we leave office.

Declare conflicts of interest and be transparent

- 1. We will declare any business, personal or other interest that we have in connection with the board's business, and these will be recorded in the <u>register</u> of <u>business interests.</u>
- 2. We will also declare any conflict of loyalty at the start of any meeting should the need arise.
- 3. If a conflicted matter arises in a meeting, we will offer to leave the meeting for the duration of the discussion and any subsequent vote.
- 4. We accept that the Register of Business Interests will be published on the Trust's website.
- 5. We will act as a trustee/local governor; not as a representative of any group.
- 6. We accept that in the interests of open governance, our full names, date of appointment, terms of office, roles on the Trust Board, attendance records, relevant business and pecuniary interests, category of governor/trustee and the body responsible for appointing us will be published on the Trust website.
- 7. We accept that information relating to board members will be collected and recorded on the DfE's national database (Get Information About Schools), some of which will be publicly available.

We understand that potential or perceived breaches of this code will be taken seriously and that a breach could lead to formal sanctions.
